EXHIBITORS, JUDGES & STEWARDS RULE BOOK – 2024

Please note that the BFS have revised the above handbook, so there are a few changes that we will have to be aware of. Most of the amendments just add clarity: -

FLOWERS - GENERAL -

ADDITION – 'ideally the pollen is just breaking on the anthers'

For Bush; Shrub; Standards, Hanging Baskets & Pots - Interconnecting supports constitute a framework which is not allowed and will be deemed to be NAS and a judge's comment card placed by the exhibit. (Please note for fans, espaliers, decorative standard, pyramids, any other shape etc, interconnecting supports remain acceptable.)

Greater use of Judge's comment cards to explain their decisions.

<u>More attention is to be given to the proportion of pot to plant</u>: - with plants that are either too small or too large.

Prematurely opened buds remain unacceptable but additionally will be down-pointed.

DECORATIVE STANDARD – a clearer, comprehensive ruling/description has been given to differentiate between: - A PLAITED STEM STANDARD, A TWISTED STEM STANDARD and A MULTI STEMMED STANDARD – if you are planning to show these, it is definitely worth purchasing the new rulebook.

SPECIES AND VARIANTS EXCLUDING ENCLIANDRA – Decorative fruit should be allowed to develop as an added attraction, but it is desirable but not essential and a lack of fruit will be deemed detrimental and lead to the exhibit being down pointed.

SPECIES AND VARIANTS EXCLUDING ENCLIANDRA – Plants in this section must be correctly named **and should be spelt correctly**.

ENCLIANDRA SECTION - Decorative fruit/seed pods must be allowed to develop as an added attraction, but it is desirable but not essential **and a lack of fruit will be deemed detrimental and lead to the exhibit being down pointed**.

TRIPHYLLA SECTION - Plants in this section must be correctly named **and should be spelt correctly**.

Care must be taken not to confuse an array of buds as open flowers especially on the larger exhibits.

10. Amendment: - Separate comment cards to read Judge's report cards.

16. **Amendment**: - Judges should be available to answer questions for at least one hour to read Judges **MUST...**

18. Amendment: - Comment cards have been replaced with Judges' Report cards

STEWARDS GUIDELINES

Additional check: - Check and ensure that there is a clear view from the front of all Bonsai exhibits. Only moving exhibits with the agreement of the exhibitor.

9. Addition – Hands etc, must be cleaned after handling the exhibits.

DURING JUDGING A STEWARD MUST

1. Addition: - ... and should not converse with the judge/s unless spoken to first.

2. Addition: - Not handle exhibits unless requested.

6. Addition: - ... and ensure that all 1st place cards remain face down until all trophies and awards have been judged.

EXHIBITORS RULES

7. Addition: - Species, Hardies and Triphyllas...Exhibits in these classes cannot be marked as 'Unknown'.

11. Addition: - Species which are not on the Show List can be exhibited in the 'Catch All' class.

12. Addition: - ... Triphyllas which are not on the BFS Triphylla List can be exhibited in the Triphylla Type class.

A revision of these lists have been made this year, so please familiarise yourself with the lists to ensure that your exhibit is put in the correct class come show day.
