I have an indication then whether we have too much savoury or too many desserts.

## GROWING FUCHSIAS

Taken from one of our own past Newsletters (October 1995): -

#### **OVER-WINTERING FUCHSIAS**

- 1. Plants can be buried in the garden at a depth where frost cannot reach them, say 18 inches to 2 feet. Remove all the leaves and prune lightly. Mark the spot where they are buried.
- 2. Plants can be stored in a dormant state in any frost free area, but I would suggest that the temperature does not exceed 40°F as they may decide to start into growth. Remove all leaves and prune lightly, check occasionally and water lightly if dry. Do not allow the compost to become wet as this can cause the roots to rot. In the spring start the plant into growth by putting it into a light, warmer area (40°F is sufficient) and do not increase the watering until there is leaf growth to remove it from the compost.
- 3. If you can maintain a temperature of 40°F you can over-winter plants in a greenhouse/Conservatory. Remove all the leaves and prune lightly, they will remain in very slow growth until the light level increases in the spring, again do not over-water.
